# VI. HEALTH HAZARD DATA

ORAL INGESTION: Low oral toxicity/Acute oral tests for product showed no deaths in rats at 5200 mg/kg. (Unpublished Rhone-Poulenc sponsored toxicity study.)

EYE CONTACT: May be irritating to eyes while curing (15 min).

During the 15 minute curing process in moist air, methyl ethylketoxime (2-Buthaneone) CAS # (96-29-7) is released to max 3%. It presents no serious toxic risk. Toxin of oxime: Acute oral/rat/LD <sub>50</sub> 2500/mg/kg/Acute dermal/rat/LD <sub>50</sub>>500 mg/kg (Bayer)/after curing, the polymerized product may be considered inert.

SKIN CONTACT: May be irritating to the skin before and during curing.

SKIN ABSORPTION: LOW TOXICITY DERMALLY. No death in rabbits at 2200 mg/kg of product applied dermally. (Unpublished Rhone-Poulenc sponsored toxicity study.)

CARCINOGENICITY: This product does not contain any ingredients designated by IARC, NTP, ACGIH or OSHA as a probably human carcinogen.

INHALATION (TLV OR SUGGESTED CONTROL FIGURE): TLV not established.

EFFECTS FROM INHALATION OVER EXPOSURE: LOW TOXICITY BY INHALATION. No deaths observed in rats when inhaled at dose level of 200 mg/1/hr. May be irritating to respiratory tract before and during curing.
